WILD KAKWA FOREST LAND USE ZONE
Date Established: June, 1985 as Wild Kakwa Forest Land Use Zone, and August, 1987 as Wild Kakwa Wildland Recreation Area.
Size: 647 square kilometers.
Purpose: Prevents overuse of critical wildlife areas and motorized vehicle users during riding season.
Restrictions: Motorized vehicles are permitted on trails designated for such use by signs posted in the zone. Vehicle access will be permitted at all times to the Kakwa Falls semi-serviced parking area, a one-kilometer hike from the Falls.

SAFETY AND BACKCOUNTRY ETHICS
ALBERTA FOREST SERVICE TRAILS

- Be prepared for your activity. Know your physical limits.
- All backcountry travelers should use camp stoves. If you do use a wood fire, use suitable fuel, use 20 hours, how so, manage equipment, pack, and pack out everything you pack in, leave minimum impact camping sites. Do not litter.
- Bring appropriate extra clothing, even on warm days. High energy food, waterproofed lanterns, and an insulated blanket may be necessary in winter months.
- In the cold seasons, be familiar with the emergency treatment of hypothermia and frostbite.
- Bring a first aid kit and repair supplies for your equipment. Make sure all gear is ready to use before you leave home.
- Never travel in the backcountry by yourself. Always let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Always fragrances and in the area. Please do not disturb traps.
- Always must be kept under control.
- Leave the site clean for whatever activity you choose to do.
- Leave all your trash where you find them so they can be enjoyed by others.
- You are traveling in "backcountry". Please take the proper precautions.
